On 2-9-2016 at approximately 1420 hours, I responded to the area of Walton Hall in reference to the report of racial slurs being said to a large group of Uplift Hampton Preparatory (UHP) students and staff. I met with the reporting party at Hullabaloo Hall. I identified the reporting party as _____ by her DL _____

_____ is a teacher at Uplift Hampton Preparatory School located in Dallas, Texas. She was one of several teachers who were with a large (approximately 60-70) group of UHP students (approximately 15-17 years of age) who were taking a tour of Texas A&M University. _____ reported the UHP group walking across the South side of Walton Hall toward Hullabaloo Hall. She advised that the group slowed down near the picnic tables at Walton Hall. She advised that she believed that her students were conversing with several individuals at the picnic tables. She advised that she heard someone yell a racial slur. _____ advised that she heard a female voice say "nigger". She also said she heard someone say the phrase "Go back to where you came from". _____ also advised that she heard "Go to bonfire". _____ was unable to describe to me who had said any of the comments. _____ believed that the individuals involved were still in or around the picnic table area. The students of UHP began to continue on their walking tour of Texas A&M University Campus. Officer Saffold remained with _____ while I walked toward the picnic tables of Walton Hall to observe any interaction between TAMU students and UHP students. No interaction was observed at that time.

I did contact the small (approximately 13) group of individuals at the picnic tables. The group advised that they did talk to the UHP students and provided them with directions. They advised that they hadn't said any Walton Hall "chants". I identified the only female in the group as _____ by her name and DOB (DL # _____).

_____ advised that there was music being played and multiple other conversations going on within both groups as she talked to some of the UHP students. She advised that she did not use a racial slur in any way. She said she did not hear any racial slurs being used by people in or near her group. No further information to report at this time.

On 2-10-2016 at approximately 1040 hours, I contacted _____ again to inquire if the rest of the tour was without incident. I was unable to talk to her and left a message with her at that time.

On 02/11/16, at approximately 1900 hrs., Dispatch advised me that a woman was on the phone asking questions about a racial slur incident that had been reported on campus. I made contact with the woman on the phone who identified herself as a TAMU student. had questions about why she had to go see the Dean of her Department tomorrow (02/12/16) about the racial incident. I advised her that she needed to contact the Dean's office to find out why and she stated she had been given a letter telling her to be there at hours. She then started asking questions related to the incident. She asked if there was any mention of a female speaking with 2 of the groups female members over by SBISA. She specifically wanted to know if any mention of a person

was told to the Police. I advised her that I did not see any mention of that in the initial report to us and that I did not know. She stated that she was and that she did speak to two (2) female high school students but that it was over by SBISA sidewalk and not over by PA 32 and Walton Hall.

was upset that we (UPD) was instructing her to go to the Deans office and that we had not even made any contact with her regarding this issue. I advised her that we (UPD) did not send her a letter advising her to contact her Dean and as far as I knew she was not a suspect in this case. I asked if she made any comments and she stated No, but that she did speak to the two female students for a few minutes. She stated that she

and asked if she or they would be (She told me that the other students had told her they had t

). stated that one of the girls told her that yes, many people and at that point the other student told her she was stupid that it was stated that the girl said for her not to call her stupid and stated that she told her that she did not think she was stupid and then they parted ways.

While speaking to me stated that she never said the "N" word or said anything else demeaning toward the other girls. I asked why she thought she would be called into the Dean's office or linked to this incident. She stated that her Residence Graduate Hall Director came to her around midnight last night because she asking her questions about the incident. She advised me that she told her that she spoke to the two girls but did not say anything to them that was racially motivated.

I again advised that the school was also investigating the incident as well as our Detectives. I told her that the Dean has the authority to call her in to ask questions on things but that at this time I did not know of her being a suspect in this incident. I offered to her that I could have a Detective contact her in the morning if she wanted to speak to one of them about the incident and her involvement. She stated that she would like that very much. She advised that she had class until and asked that we call her at between 0900 and 1020hrs. She stated her appointment with her Dean was at hours and she would like to know what was going on before then.

I then ended the call with her.

At approximately 2255 hrs. Dispatch again called me and advised that [REDACTED] was on the phone again and very upset. I made contact with [REDACTED] and she immediately started speaking loudly and in an excited voice that Fox News was broadcasting her interaction with the two women on their television show. She went on to state that she was being slandered and wanted me to do something about it. I asked her if she heard her name being used on the TV and she stated no, not her name but they were saying that she [REDACTED] and described her. I advised her that if they didn't broadcast her name then they did not slander her and that they were probably just relaying what was told to them by some other party. She claimed that the facts were distorted and not what really happened. I advised her she may want to contact Student Counsel for advice on both issues but that at this time I could not do anything about the media broadcasting the story. She told me that she needed to talk to her mom on the other phone but that she knew she was going to try and make her [REDACTED] and she did not want to give them up. I advised her that was a personal issue between them.

I asked her again before hanging up if she wanted a Detective to contact her in the morning and she stated Yes she did.

I told her that she can give her dad my number to her father if he would like to call me.

I was able to get information that she did have a meeting with the Dean.

He said that I could call his boss [REDACTED] to see.

I called and spoke to [REDACTED]. He advised that I could come by and speak to him.

Lt. Crenshaw and I met with [REDACTED] at the [REDACTED]. We introduced ourselves and explained to him again why we were talking to him. I asked him to tell me about what he remembers.

He said that he met them by Sbisa Dining Hall. He advised that he was an alumni of the school and he was wanting to meet up with them. He said that they were lost and ended up at Hullabaloo Hall. He said that they then walked down Military Walk to Rudder. He said that the teacher asked him if they have racial problems here? He said that is when they told him about what had happened. I asked him if he was with them when the incident occurred? He said no. I asked him if while they were walking to Rudder if anything had happened or said to them from anybody else? He said no.

On 2/19/2016, at approximately 1051 hrs, Detective Vykuval, Officer Walker, Officer Hickman and myself arrived at Uplift Hampton Preparatory school for interviews. We met with [REDACTED] who is [REDACTED] of the school. We introduced ourselves. I asked him if we could speak to the teachers that were there and in separate rooms. He said that he could accommodate that.

Detective Vykuval and Officer Walker went to one room and Officer Hickman and I went to a room in the front office.

We spoke to [REDACTED] first. I asked her if she can tell me what had happened from the beginning of the day.

She advised that they arrived at Rudder Tower at approximately 1400-1415 hrs. She advised that they met a young man from the visitor center. She said that he informed them that they were low staffed and gave them a map and helped point them in the right direction to Hullabaloo. He told them that someone will meet them at Hullabaloo and will escort them back to Rudder.

She said that they began walking. She advised that there is always something going on with the students with the banners and everything. She said that the students were getting excited about all of it. She said that they walked to the street with the big fountain (Sbisa) across on the other side. (Houston Street) She advised that there was an African American gentleman out there rapping and dancing. She said that they walked over there and asked what he was doing. He advised them that he was a professor and that he teaches psychology. They then began to catch up to the group. She said that two students who were at the back were talking to a white female. She said that when they began to walk away one of the high school student made the comment that was strange. She said why? The student told her that the A&M student asked and pointed toward the student's patch, which shows the Hampton patch, where you're from how do you think they would take [REDACTED] . Don't you like [REDACTED] ?

She said that they then caught up to the group by Walton Hall. She said that that she noticed that the high school students were looking back and turning around and looking at the group that was sitting at the table. She said that there were tables under the trees. She explained that there were about ten guys and one girl at the table and a male in a

[REDACTED] and jeans sitting on the hill. She stated that there was a conversation going back and forth, but could not tell what was being said. She asked another teacher what was going on. She said that a student made the comment, I said it. A teacher told her that the students were taunting the students saying, go back to where you belong, make sure you check out the bonfire and take a look at our [REDACTED] and then they started using the "N" word. She said that they were getting worried about what was going on. They stopped a student that was walking into Walton Hall and asked what name of the dorm was an he told them. They then observed a female Corp of cadet with the boots. They stopped

her and asked for the phone number to the police department which she gave them.

She advised that two police officers arrived. She said that she asked another African American student that was at Hullabaloo about if they have had race issues on campus. He asked what do you mean. She told him the story and he said you are talking about the bone heads at Walton Hall. We always have problems with them. They don't mean any harm.

I then showed her a map and asked her to point out where they had walked which she did. She said that when they left they cut across the parking lot through PA 32 to avoid them.

I asked her to explain again where she was in line with the group.

She advised that she was at the back of the line to keep the kids together. She said that one of the kids said I'm a minority. She stated that one of the teachers came back to tell them what had happened. She said that some of the guys at the tables were still talking but she could not tell what they were saying.

I asked her that when she caught up with the group was everything over with what had been said and she said yes. She said that she did not here any of the comments that were said.

I asked her what directions the young lady went. She said that the girl went back toward Rudder Tower and not their directions.

She advised that one gentleman that was sitting on the hill which was white, wearing a and and and would stand and say something and then the group would say something. We have been unable to identify that person at this time.

The student was not involved in the incident at Walton Hall.

She advised that the students were on the left and Walton Hall was on the right. I asked about the amount of students that were in the group? She estimated about 7 to 10 with a female.

The map that was used to show the area will be attached to the case.

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On 2/19/2016, at 1130 hrs, we met with [REDACTED] in the same room. I asked her to tell me what had happened. She said that they started at Rudder Tower and then walked to Hullabaloo. She advised that she was to the front and middle of the group. She advised that when they passed by Walton Hall, they heard loud music playing and some kids were sitting down by the tables. [REDACTED] said that there were between 10 and 15 students. [REDACTED] said that the song that she was hearing was a controversial song by Beyoncé called "Formation". She said that they observed their kids listening to the song and talking to some of the students at the table. [REDACTED] said that the students at the table began saying check out bonfire.com and go back to where you came from. She said that she was disoriented and could not believe what she was hearing. [REDACTED] advised that a student in the line then step out and stated "you do know that we're black right". She then told the student to get back in line and stay focused and let's go to where we need to be.

[REDACTED] said that she moved to the back to get the kids to where they needed to be. She said that the students at the table kept chanting to go back to where you came from and check out bonfire.com. [REDACTED] said that is when she heard a student say the "N" word repeatedly. She said that the word "nigger" was repeatedly said by more than one student. She said that it all happened so fast, but that she did hear a female voice say the word. She said that the "N" word was being said when they were chanting. She said that there might have been maybe two females but was not sure.

She said that when they arrived at Hullabaloo she pulled the other teachers to the side and asked them if they heard the students saying the "N" word? [REDACTED] said that the other teachers did not hear it, but could tell something was going on. [REDACTED] then said that a teacher [REDACTED] said we need to report this and to make sure the kids are safe. [REDACTED] said that she was stating to the teachers that she could not believe that this had just happened. [REDACTED] said that they then were able to ask a student what dorm they were standing by which they were told Walton. They then found a cadet who gave them the number to the police department.

[REDACTED] stated that when they entered Hullabaloo two police officers arrived inside to take the report. She said that they went back to Rudder Tower with no incident.

[REDACTED] said that she wanted a coffee and a student took her back to Hullabaloo by golf cart back by the students. She said that she looked at them and they looked at her but that nothing was said.

I then showed her the map of the area. She said that they walked between Walton Hall and the tables. She said that when they left back to Rudder they walked toward the parking lot 32 and that the students were to the left of them again.

I asked again about when they came close to the students at the tables did anything happen other than that. She said that none of the students touched their kids. She said that it seemed all innocent and their kids were enjoying seeing the other students playing the music and seeing what campus life is. [REDACTED] said that the students were saying something but not sure. [REDACTED] said that the very first thing that she heard was "go back to where you came from". She said that she was shocked and could not believe that it was being said to our students. [REDACTED] said the next thing said was "check out bonfire .com". She said that when she was moving to the middle is when she heard the "N" word

She said that one of her students came up to her and stated that she did hear the students say go back to where you came from, but that it might be in reference to one of the kids wearing a UT backpack.

I asked her if any of the students heard the word. She said that she was not sure but that they had a meeting with all the students when they got back. said that they were not pulling any of the students to the side to ask them if they had heard it. She said that she did not know if any of them heard it.

I asked her what the girl was wearing that had said the word. She said that it might be a black shirt and

I asked if the word was being used in a chant or if it was random. stated that it was random. I asked her if there was laughter during the chanting or anything else going on. She said that she did not remember anything else.

I spoke to after the interview. I asked him if we could speak to the kids that were around. He said that he only had one with permission and that none of the others had permissions at this time to speak to us.

Detective Vykuval and Officer Walker spoke to the student.

I gave my card. I asked him if he could have the kids that were there when the chants and yelling began to e-mail me if their parents give permission with what they remember what had happened.

When Detective Vykuval and Officer Walker were finished we thanked them for their time and left.

The interview was recorded.

Detective Vykuval and I met him at Traditions and gave him a ride back to the office where we interviewed him. The time was approximately 1409 hrs. He was advised that he did not have to talk to us and that he could leave at any time. He understood.

I asked him to tell me what happened that day. He said that they were hanging out playing dominoes and listening to music. _____ advised that a large group was walking down the side walk and they appeared lost. He said that _____ got up and asked them if he could help. He said that they were looking for Hullabaloo. _____ advised that _____ began walking them down the side walk by Walton hall and was half way down when the tour guide came to help them from parking area 32. He said that they walked off and then about ten minutes later the police came up.

He said that about 6 at the table with people walking around. He advised that they said howdy and the group said howdy. He was asked about the music playing. He said yes that it was electro dance music. I asked him if they had Beyoncé music playing and he said no. He was asked him if there was any chants where they were yelling at each other. He said no. He was asked if anyone said anything about bonfire toward the group and he said no. He said someone might have been talking about bonfire but it was to the group at the tables and no one else. I asked who said it and he advised that he did not know.

I asked him who was out there. He gave me names of _____ and _____ He was able to produce some phone numbers for them. _____ said that he was sitting at the fourth table on the far right.

He was asked about the incident with the backpack. He said that _____ made reference about the back pack, but that it was not directed toward the kids. I asked him why the group would go through all the trouble to call the police if you're saying nothing was said to them. _____ became upset and said that he did not say anything was not said, but that they did not say anything and that he did not hear what was said. _____ began pointing the finger at different areas that people might have been standing when it was said. I told him that we went and talked to the group in Dallas. I told him that they pointed at one group only and that there were no other groups. He said people were saying bonfire but that they were not directed toward the students. I asked him who were the people and he said that he did not know but it was people behind him and by the grill. He said that nothing was maliciously said toward the kids.

At that time, a white female approached two female students and started talking to them by the fountain. It appeared that she was very interested in the students and was asking them questions. Once the interaction was completed, the two students walked away and they started to catch up with the rest of the group. At this time, _____ was told about the _____ At first the students thought the _____ and the female told them they were _____. At that time, the students walked away to catch up with the rest of the group. This is when _____ was told about the interaction with the female student concerning _____. at the same time, they were catching up with the rest of the group. While catching up to the group, this is when she noticed a lot of noise going on but couldn't tell if it was coming from their group or the students at the dorm. While approaching the rest of the group, they could hear howdy because they have been hearing this since they came to campus. Before catching up to the group, _____ advised that Mrs. _____ approached them and asked if they heard that? _____ advised that they did not hear anything distinct to them.

_____ advised that she was told by Mrs. _____ that there was a problem and pointed at the college students. _____ was told that it started out when a college student told them to go back where they came from. _____ advised that she was told a student told Mrs. _____ that they were probably talking about the UT backpack that another student was wearing. _____ was told that a student yelled out, "Don't forget Bonfire. Com." _____ was told that another college student said go back where you came from this is when a female student stated, "You do realize we're black." Mrs. _____ told _____ that she told the kids not to interact and to move forward. According to _____, Mrs. _____ heard a female voice say the "N" word when she was moving the kids along and she advised that Mrs. _____ heard it multiply times. _____ advised that it must have happened when she was walking up with the last of the students because Mrs. _____ asked her if she heard it. At that time, a college student walked past them and she asked them where they were at and he gave their location. _____ advised that she looked around for one of the emergency blue phones, but did not notice one in the area.

saw a female cadet student and asked her if she knew how to make contact with the University Police. advised that she they did not tell the cadet what was going on and she was able to look at the back of her student ID to give her the number. advised that she gave the number to Mrs. to contact the Police while she contacted her school to make them aware of the situation.

I asked if the same girl from the fountain incident was setting at the table and she stated no. advised that the fountain incident and the hall incident were two separate events. I asked how many people were at the table and she advised about ten. stated that the group at the table was talking loud and had music playing. When asked about the students seated at the table, a female was setting in the middle of the group and was wearing a advised that Mrs. had a better description of the female student. I asked what type of the female was wearing and she advised a type . I asked if anyone saw the subject that said the slur and she advised to ask Mrs. After explaining how everyone was contacted regarding school officials and the police department, I asked what the attitude of the college students after the incident. advised that it was quieter and not as much talking with the music playing in the back ground.

Officer Walker asked several questions about how many kids were around Mrs. at the time of the incident and locations of the students. Several photographs of the area were shown to determine the path of the group and locations of the students at the time of the incident to help understand the path that was taken. At this time, we were told there was a total of 63 students and the group was stretched and not all in one group. was asked if the student involved in the came back to the area around Walton Hall and she advised no. stated that the girl from the fountain incident went the opposite direction and pointed toward Millner Hall on the map. stated that the incident at the Fountain and Walton Hall happened at almost the same time. I asked if any students came up to her afterwards and said that they heard anything else and she advised no. advised that they were very discreet around the students because they didn't want to cause more alarm.

Shortly after speaking with we met with advised that the students were dropped off at the Visitors Center and walked toward the Fish Pond. advised that this is when they saw the guy rapping by the pond and they curved around and walked toward Walton Hall. advised that two of the girls at the end of the line asked for a couple pennies to throw into the pond. believed that if the girls wouldn't have walked back toward the pond they would have all been together, but this is when they were approached by the female student about . It appeared the conversation was good because the student pointed at the patch on their shirts and explained where they were from. At that time, two African American females came walking through and asked them where they were from. While they spoke to the two college students, they were still watching the two female students from their group talk to the female by the fountain. At that time, their two

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students came up to them and said that the interaction was strange. The student spoke about the conversation and how the student which at first they thought . The college student corrected them and said that it is a and asked if they could . advised that the students told her no and walked away. At this time, they started walking to catch up with the rest of the group since they were left behind and they spoke to the students about what had just happened. advised that when they approached the rest of the group, they could hear some commotion and noticed the students' kind of looking at each other. A group of Caucasian males and a female were setting at a park bench. advised that before they got back to the group, she told the students that were with them to be quiet because she could observe a negative vibe coming from the group. advised that she heard Bonfire and go back where you came from and check out Bonfire.Com. When they made it back to the group, this is when Mrs. came up to them and asked if they heard that. stated that she heard Bonfire and go back where you came from and then Mrs. stated that this is not all she heard. Mrs. told that she heard the "N" word. advised that they stopped and looked at the group and she made contact with the eyes of one of the students setting at the bench. advised that the student she was staring at appeared to have some conviction in his eyes and he waved at her. described the student as a thicker type Caucasian male and did not appear to be taking part of group. advised it appeared like he knew he shouldn't be there. advised that the other ones in the group appeared to go back to what they were doing before they walked up. At this time, they stopped a student walking past and asked him where they were at. The student asked where do you need to go and I will take you there. responded back and advised that she just needed their location and he stated Walton Hall. While other members of the group were talking to the student, a female Cadet came walking though and she asked for the number to the University Police Department and the student looked at the back of her ID and gave her the number. explained the incident to the dispatcher and at first thought a police officer was not coming because of a free speech issue. After speaking to dispatch, Officers arrived on scene to assess the situation. After talking to the Officers and letting them know what happen, the Officers walked to the tables to address the students and they away from the Walton area and towards the parking lot. I advised it was a very quiet walk back to the meeting area before the tour. I advised that after the tours, two members of the group went back to Hullabaloo to the Starbucks and a couple of the students were still at the table.

Throughout the interview with pictures of the area were used to help illustrate the areas on campus where the incidents took place. While looking at the pictures, we talked about where people were seated and I asked about the demeanor of the students at the table. advised that the students seated at the table were playing a Beyonce song that probably caused the controversy. stated that they were listening to different music when they came back through. advised that there were between 10 - 15 people at the table at the time of the incident.

stated that there was only one female in the group and she appeared to be part of the crew. The female was

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wearing a :type with some on it. advised there was a student wearing a and shirt wearing pants that appeared to be the leader of the group doing the chants. advised that she could not remember what they were saying but it didn't appear racial. According to , Mrs. appeared visibly upset, and advised this is when one of their students said, "You do know we're black." said this was in regards to the go home commit. advised that she was told it was the girl that said the "N" word. I asked to tell me about the male student that waved at her. I was told he was wearing shorts and possibly a colored shirt. asked if we have cameras in the area outside the dorms and we advised in some areas yes, but not in all areas.

Officer Walker asked if she could remember the female at Walton Hall and she spoke about how it was a different female from at the fountain incident. I asked again if she could remember what they were saying in the chants and she advised she couldn't remember. I asked about the behavioral of the group when they came walking up and

advised it was quiet but they had three teachers and two students with them and no exchange verbally was made. Once the interview was completed, we met with Detective Tumlinson and Officer Hickman. Detective Tumlinson made contact with the school principle and we were told they needed parent permission before we could talk to the students. I was told that one student that was involved in the incident at the Fish Pond had parent permission and we could speak with her.

Officer Walker and I made contact with along with school staff. I asked her to explain what happened. advised that she and a friend were approached by the student by the fountain and they engaged in small talk. advised the female asked them if they and pointed them out. advised that her friend thought they were told her no.

At that time, they walked back to the teachers to catch up with the group and told them what happened and that it was strange. I asked if she heard anything that was going on in the front of the group and she advised no. I asked if she heard any slur commits and she advised no because they were at the back of the group. After speaking with , she returned to class.

At this point, no other students had parent permission to speak with us and we left the area.

I informed him about the investigation and asked him to tell me what had happened.

He said that a tour guide came up and said thanks guys I got it and they went back to the table. He said that they exchanged howdy with the students that were passing by. He said that the kid with the T.U. backpack came by. He stated that someone said "hey that kid has a T.U. backpack". He said that the group kept walking on and they kept chilling at the table. said that the University police showed up later when the group was gone.

He advised that they were playing electro music and "bones" dominoes. I asked him who was playing Beyoncé and he said that there was no music like that. He advised that the music was probably coming from his phone and he does not have Beyoncé.

He was able to confirm some of the names that were there. He said that there are about 60 people that usually come and hang out around the tables.

He was asked if there was any yelling going on when the group was coming by. said that might have been just the normal Walton stuff. He said that they are a rambunctious group. He said that whenever tour groups come by they are always say howdy. was asked about the bonfire yelling. said that usually one person will yell bonfire and then it goes around the table. I asked to explain what happens when one person yells Bonfire. advised the others yell back Bonfire. Detective Tumlinson asked if there was anyone on the hill and he advised no. Detective Tumlinson asked who started the Bonfire chant and he advised he didn't know. Detective Tumlinson asked if he heard the student from the group say, you know we are black and he advised that didn't happen. advised the only people that approached them was the cops after the group passed.

I asked if it could have been said when he was helping the group and he advised that he didn't hear it. advised that he finished his cigarette before walking the group because it is not polite to smoke and then he sat at the table where the non-smokers sat. Detective Tumlinson asked what the group was talking about when he sat back down and he advised random stuff. Detective Tumlinson asked when the Bonfire chant started and he advised after the last group passed. advised that majority of the interaction was Howdy. I asked if he spoke with anyone else from the University about the incident and he advised no. was asked if he was still at the tables when the police showed up and he advised yes. I asked if anyone had left before the police arrived and he advised he didn't think so. Pictures from the Officers recording were shown of the people in the area so could ID some of the students. was not in the pictures from the table we were presented. Before closing the interview, I asked to tell

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

On Texas A&M campus the whole Junior class was walking towards the sample dorms, or the new dorms, but before we got there we were encountered by a group of Texas A&M students. Picture a whole Junior class saying howdy to everyone, laughing, talking, and having a good time. We come across smoke aromas and a group of college students sitting at a picnic table. If I can recall, it was maybe four males standing around and smoking and a single female sitting at the table. I was walking alongside one of my classmates and behind a classmate that was wearing a UT backpack. We were halfway passing the picnic table and I heard the comment, "go back to where you came from" by one of the Texas A&M students. It took me a moment to realize what had just been said. I replied, "You know we're black, right?" trying to give them the acknowledgement that they should change their word choice. After that, we continued to walk past and I looked to see if the chaperones heard what I said but they were talking amongst themselves and looked very concerned. I turned around and continued walking with the rest of the Junior class.

At approximately 5:00pm on Tuesday, February 9, 2016, was contacted by follow up with Resident regarding an incident she was involved in earlier that day. CD went to Resident room in , but nobody was present. At approximately 6:00pm, CD went back to Resident room to see if she was there. Resident opened the door, and introduced herself as the community director of . After the introduction, Resident stated "okay, I know why you're here and I'm really stressed out about this because that's not what happened at all" so asked her to explain what happened earlier in the day outside of Walton Hall involving a tour group. Resident explained that she was hanging out with some of the guys outside of Walton Hall when a tour group approached. Resident explained that they all greeted the tour group with "howdy" and asked how their day was going but nothing else was exchanged between them and the tour group. Resident explained that a little while after this, the police showed up and questioned her about making racial slurs towards the tour group since the report that the police received said that a female was the one making the comments and she was the only female present. Resident said that the entire time she was near Walton Hall nobody said anything at all to or about the tour group.

At approximately 4pm on Wednesday, February 10, 2016 Director received a text message and then phone call, immediately after, from Associate Director of Residence Education, Christine Thoorsell regarding an incident in which one of her residents, was allegedly involved. After retrieving resident class schedule from Thoorsell, GHD went back to to see if she could speak with resident GHD tried to make contact with resident at 6:30, 7, 7:45, 9:15, and again at 9:45pm. Resident was not in her room, nor had her roommate seen her. GHD asked if the roommate felt comfortable and could let resident know that GHD was looking for her and the roommate agreed. GHD then left the office at approximately 11:40pm to take over paperwork to the Office when she saw resident approaching GHD approached resident and asked her if they could go have a quick conversation. Once in the office, GHD asked resident if she had been near Walton Hall the day before, on February 9, and had noticed anything out of the ordinary. Resident said she couldn't remember. GHD asked her if she had interacted with anyone from a tour group or a high school group that had come to campus on that day. Resident said she had been talking with three young women who she identified as being "Hispanic" and from a "charter school." Resident told GHD that she engaged in conversation with the young women about dress code, as they were in uniform, and asked if they thought they would be allowed to like the . Resident said that at first the young women thought they were said they did not think that the school would have a

problem with them. Then one of the young women said "no, those are ." Resident said that the young women still said that they would probably be okay in their dress code. When asked further about any potential racial slurs or conversations that came up that day resident said she could not remember any. Throughout this conversation resident was very preoccupied about why was asking about these incidents and who reported that it was her. told that she had received report from individuals that she worked with about the incident and that she had been identified by :

GHD also told her that this conversation was not meant in any way to be accusatory, but rather information seeking in order to figure out exactly what happened and how. After this conversation, resident was still preoccupied with who had said something and who had singled her out. GHD spoke with resident about how different symbols, particularly in this , could have different meanings for different people and that although people might not outright say it, they may be feeling uncomfortable because of the symbol. Resident told GHD that "Muslims with their headscarves make me feel uncomfortable" and continued to speak about women's rights and oppression of women. "But are we going to ask them to stop wearing them? No, because it's their religion. I still struggle seeing them on campus." GHD told resident that she was not telling her that she needed to

that resident was wearing, but to understand the different meanings behind these that might make someone feel uncomfortable and even unwelcome. Resident told GHD that she felt "hurt and attacked" that GHD had singled her out and that there were plenty of other people on campus who and she did not see them being singled out. At this point GHD told resident that she understood and heard her feelings, that she did not want resident to feel singled out and that she was trying to figure out the facts of the day and nothing more. GHD told resident about freedom of speech and that people can say and wear whatever they please, but it is important to understand that those things might still make people feel uncomfortable. GHD told resident that she was happy to answer any questions or concerns she might have and that she hoped that resident was not leaving with the thought that this was in any way supposed to be a personal attack on her. Resident told GHD that she understood and she did not have any questions. GHD reminded resident to have a conversation with her roommate to set up a

time to meet with their Resident Advisor in order to complete their roommate contract. Resident told GHD that she would and then told her about the tattoo she had just got. Resident showed GHD the tattoo and spoke with GHD about how she was unsure whether or not she should tell her mother, who is very against tattoos, that she just got another one. GHD asked resident some questions about her mother and tried to help her through what to do. Resident described to GHD the new tattoo which . Resident then began discussing her pro-life, "anti-abortion" stance and GHD responded by saying that she had some interesting points. Resident then said, "I take it you're pro-abortion?" To which GHD replied that she likes to take in all of the information on both sides and make up her mind about an issue, which is something that can be useful in many situations. GHD said she feels that it is best when both sides of an argument can be heard and discussed. It does not mean that anyone needs to change their mind necessarily but everyone is heard. Resident then spoke about how some people believe that violence is the way to get your voice heard and that she was not so sure about that. She said that people who made change like Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. could have used violence. "He could have killed a bunch of white people and claimed it was for all of the black people that had been lynched, but he didn't, he held marches and sit ins." Resident told GHD that she thinks that people can get their point across without violence and GHD agreed with her and asked her if she thought that non-violent protests are more effective in some ways. Resident agreed and brought up the point that, even so, when she becomes of legal age, she plans on getting a gun to protect her. Resident then went on to talk about how she has learned to shoot guns and her family has guns and she likes to go to the shooting range but when she gets a gun it will just be to protect herself. GHD then told resident that she appreciated her coming to the office to speak and that she did not want to keep her too much longer as resident had mentioned that she needed to get going to bed. Resident got up to leave and told GHD her final thoughts on telling her mother about her tattoo. GHD wished her good luck with telling her mother about the tattoo and also on the two exams that resident had coming up the next two days. At 12:16am Resident left the Office.

Community Director and Director
was notified about some racial slur comments in front of Walton
Hall around the tables. CD and GHD sat down with Walton
Hall Resident Resident Student
Student and Student .

These students stated to CD and GHD that a tour group
walked by the tables (between Walton Hall and Parking Lot 32) and
asked where the 24-hour Desk/Hullabaloo desk is at. At this time, a
tour guide had come in from behind and led them over to Hullabaloo
Hall.

During the time the tour group came and left, Resident Resident
Student Student and Student mentioned
about 15-20 residents/students were around the Walton Hall tables. It
was between classes so these 15-20 people came to the Walton Hall
tables, interacted with each other and left as those with classes got
there on time.

Resident stated that one of the prospective students had a
University of Texas-Austin backpack on. Resident mentioned this
backpack to Student but did so after the tour group had passed
by the tables and not within hearing range. According to Resident
Resident Student Student and Student
, nothing was yelled or said loudly that could have been
misconstrued by the tour group.

Student stated a cop came by a few minutes later asking if
anyone knew what happened.

Throughout the duration of everything happening, there was music
playing but nothing that would have had derogatory words – according
to the students that spoke to CD and GHD .

Arrival:

We arrived at Texas A&M University at College Station at approximately 2:00pm on Tuesday, February 9, 2016. As we walked toward the student center, we were approached by an Appelt Aggieland Visitor Center staff member who greeted us and stated that we would have to facilitate our own tour because they were understaffed. We were provided with campus maps and visitor badges. We were also directed to our first stop: Hullabaloo Dormitory.

..

On the way toward the dorm, two female Hampton Scholars standing toward the back of the line were approached by a Caucasian female student who befriended them and asked them where they were from. She then asked the students to The students saw that they were of the and immediately walked away. They approached their chaperones and reported the incident immediately.

Verbal Exchange:

Directly following that incident, a large group of Hampton scholars passed Walton Hall where a group of approximately 13 students were sitting. One of the students yelled "Go back to where you came from and "be sure to check out Bonfire.com!" At that point one of our scholars turned around and yelled "You do know that we're black, right?" A chaperone heard the incident and asked her to keep going. Her friend also grabbed her arm and forced her to continue walking toward the dorm.

The same chaperone heard the only female in the group yelling the n* word multiple times as the scholars passed. She approached the other counselors to check out the incident. The counselors decided to call the campus police. They approached an A&M male student walking to his dorm where they asked him for the name of the Hall where the incident occurred. He said that they were in front of Walton Hall. They reached out to a passing female cadet who gave them the number to campus police.

Dispatch Call:

A female dispatcher took the call and when the counselor explained the situation, the dispatcher responded that the students "weren't doing anything illegal" The chaperone asked her "Are you saying what they did was legal or illegal?" After questioning the dispatcher for clarification out of shock by the response, the dispatcher confirmed that what they were doing was in fact legal by freedom of speech. She did not condone it but that she would still dispatch officers. At that point the call ended. The counselors proceeded to Hullabaloo Dorm where they spoke with the tour guide and called Campus Police. The counselor received a call from Officer Rogers and Saffold requesting their location because he was on his way. They were extremely professional and delicate when handling the situation. Once they took the report they proceeded to address the A&M students who had the verbal exchange. They followed up with the counselor making two phone calls.

Resident Assistance

The tour guide also tried to rectify the issue by stating that he lived in Walton dorm and that he was going to report it to the RA's.

I, [REDACTED], was giving a tour to a group of students of color. Following the conclusion of my part of the tour, I was called over to a group of women by [REDACTED]. I was then informed by one of the women, who were counselors of the institution, that as the students were passing by T.O. Walton hall, on their way to Hullabaloo Hall, someone told their students, " You niggers need to go back wherever you came from. Niggers aren't allowed here." [REDACTED] told them that I was a resident of Walton Hall and that I could speak to the community. I first explained that I was a representative of the Walton hall council and that the incident was not representative of our community's values and that I was very sorry that it had happened. I further explained that I would do what I could as an executive in the hall to communicate the issue and remedy it. One of the ladies explained that their priority was the students and their safety, our conversation continued, shortly into it, one of the women received a call from UPD following up the women's report. Moments later UPD arrived and began talking to the women. That severed our conversation as the UPD began talking to the women. I stepped away and grabbed my backpack so I could walk to class. On my way out of the door, I handed one of the women my contact information so that they could reach out to me regarding what the hall could do to remedy the situation.

Hello Justin this is [REDACTED] I, and I'm here to just recap on the situation that happened with your last tour today. I was coming from smoothie king passing by Walton dorm and I didn't hear anything at the time. As I walked into Hullabaloo Hall, a group of about 5 counselors from the black school/tour approached me asking if I myself had dealt with any racism at Texas A&M, of course I said no. I asked her what made her ask me that question, and the black lady with short hair said while there tour passed by walton dorm that someone yelled saying "Go back were you came from, Niggers aren't allowed here." I was then shocked and told her Texas A&M isn't the type of place to deal such low stupidity. I then told her about my success here so far as a black student along with how im good friends with guys in Walton. However, the group of counselors were still upset then called the police. I had then grabbed [REDACTED] the tour guide to talk to them. He communicated with them then the police showed up.

That's everything that happened from my standpoint of view. I didn't hear anyone yell any crazy remarks. I didn't see or could of known who may have said that remark. The group was very respectful and calm when they talked to me.



-15 to 20 residents/students were at the tables at the time the alleged incident occurred

-One student in the tour group had on a University of Texas backpack. Resident mentioned the backpack to non-resident but did so after the tour group had passed by the tables. According to the students we spoke with nothing was yelled or said loudly that could have been misconstrued by the tour group.

-A cop came by the tables a few minutes later asking if the students at the tables knew what happened

-Music was playing, but nothing that would have had derogatory words (according to the students we spoke with)

Arrival:

We arrived at Texas A&M University at College Station at approximately 2:00pm on Tuesday, February 9, 2016. As we walked toward the student center, we were approached by an Appelt Aggieland Visitor Center staff member who greeted us and stated that we would have to facilitate our own tour because they were understaffed. We were provided with campus maps and visitor badges. We were also directed to our first stop: Hullabaloo Dormitory.

On the way toward the dorm, two female Hampton Scholars standing toward the back of the line were approached by a Caucasian female student who befriended them and asked them where they were from. She then asked the students to The students saw that they were of the and immediately walked away. They approached their chaperones and reported the incident immediately.

Verbal Exchange:

Directly following that incident, a large group of Hampton scholars passed Walton Hall where a group of approximately 13 students were sitting. One of the students yelled "Go back to where you came from and "be sure to check out Bonfire.com!" At that point one of our scholars turned around and yelled "You do know that we're black, right?" A chaperone heard the incident and asked her to keep going. Her friend also grabbed her arm and forced her to continue walking toward the dorm.

The same chaperone heard the only female in the group yelling the n* word multiple times as the scholars passed. She approached the other counselors to check out the incident. The counselors decided to call the campus police. They approached an A&M male student walking to his dorm where they asked him for the name of the Hall where the incident occurred. He said that they were in front of Walton Hall. They reached out to a passing female cadet who gave them the number to campus police.

Dispatch Call:

A female dispatcher took the call and when the counselor explained the situation, the dispatcher responded that the students "weren't doing anything illegal" The chaperone asked her "Are you saying what they did was legal or illegal?" After questioning the dispatcher for clarification out of shock by the response, the dispatcher confirmed that what they were doing was in fact legal by freedom of speech. She did not condone it but that she would still dispatch officers. At that point the call ended. The counselors proceeded to Hullabaloo Dorm where they spoke with the tour guide and called Campus Police. The counselor received a call from Officer Rogers and Saffold requesting their location because he was on his way. They were extremely professional and delicate when handling the situation. Once they took the report they proceeded to address the A&M students who had the verbal exchange. They followed up with the counselor making two phone calls.

Resident Assistance

The tour guide also tried to rectify the issue by stating that he lived in Walton dorm and that he was going to report it to the RA's.

WE HAVE NO PROOF OF WHO MAY HAVE SAID IT. THE WITNESS DOES NOT SAY THAT IT WAS DIRECTED AT HER. THERE IS NO EVIDENCE THAT IT TENDED, OR WAS INTENDED, TO CAUSE AN IMMEDIATE BREACH OF THE PEACE. THERE IS NO PROSECUTABLE CASE AT THIS TIME.
