Dear Governor Sandoval:

Thank you for your letter of January 29, 2016 regarding the State of Nevada's position on listing the Anaconda Copper Mine (Site) on the Superfund National Priorities List ("NPL"). Nevada and EPA are in agreement that the Site needs a comprehensive clean-up solution and the major construction must begin by summer 2019 in order to avoid failure of the Site's existing heap leach fluid containment systems.

I appreciate your goal of identifying private sources of capital to fund the \$32 million -\$40 million clean-up. However, if a comprehensive solution is not forthcoming from private entities, I am convinced NPL designation is the only viable option for continued federal support. In light of the urgency of this situation and our efforts to secure non-federal funds for more than fifteen years, I am asking for the State's formal response by March 29, 2016. Your concurrence would allow us to proceed with the first step of the process for formally proposing the site for listing, followed by additional public comment and dialogue, before a final listing decision in March 2017.

I would like to personally meet with the Mason Valley farmers and agricultural interests in the beginning of March, 2016 to hear from them directly about how EPA can reduce the impacts of NPL listing on their businesses. I will coordinate with NDEP on this visit.

I commend the excellent work of your Division of Environmental Protection on this Site and look forward to your response.
