AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF COMPLAINT AND WARRANT OF ARREST

STATE OF NEVADA)

COUNTY OF WASHOE)

I, Detective Stefanie Brady, do hereby swear under the penalty of perjury that the assertions of this affidavit are true.

1. That your affiant is a Detective with the Washoe County Sheriff's Office (WCSO). In that capacity, and in conjunction with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office (DCSO), I am currently assigned to the investigation into the murders of Constance (Connie) Koontz, Sophia Renken, and Gerald (Jerry) and Sharon (Sherri) David. Koontz was murdered in her residence located at 1439 James Road, Gardnerville, Nevada, sometime between 9:00 PM, on January 9, 2019, and 9:50 AM, on January 10, 2019. Ms. Renken was murdered in her residence located at 943 Dresserville Road, Gardnerville, Nevada, sometime between 4:00 PM, on January 12, 2019, and 1:00 PM, on January 13, 2019. Mrs. David and Mr. David were murdered in their residence located at 760 La Guardia Lane, Reno, Nevada, sometime between 11:30 AM on January 15, 2019, and 4:00 PM on January 16, Moreover, I am assigned to the investigation into burglaries 2019. that occurred at the aforementioned residence of Mrs. and Mr. David on or about January 3, and/or January 4, 2019. The facts and

circumstances of these investigations are documented under the following case numbers: WCSO 19-306, DCSO 19SO01032 and 19S001327. Your affiant is informed and believes and thereupon alleges the following to be a sufficient representation of facts to establish probable cause to believe that Wilber Ernesto Martinez Guzman has committed four (4) counts of Murder with the use of a Deadly Weapon, a violation of NRS 200.010, NRS 200.030, and NRS 193.165, felonies, one count of Burglary, a violation of NRS 205.060, a felony, and four (4) counts of Burglary involving a Firearm, a violation of NRS 205.060, felonies, which were committed on or about January 3, 2019, January 4, 2019, January 9-10, 2019, January 12-13, 2019, and January 15-16, 2019, in Washoe County, Nevada and Douglas County, Nevada.

- 2. On or about January 3, 2019, and/or January 4, 2019, Mr. David discovered that structures and/or a trailer on the Davids' aforementioned property had been burglarized. It was noted that during these burglaries a skill saw, several fishing poles, and a hunting bag which contained items including ammunition and possibly a pistol were stolen. This information was provided by Mr. David to a caretaker for his property and corroborated by entries on a calendar found in the Davids' residence.
- 3. On January 10, 2019, Ms. Koontz was found deceased in her aforementioned residence. There did not appear to be any forced entry. The main garage door was open, the door from the garage into the home was open and the garage man door to the back yard was open. The investigation suggests that Ms. Koontz was killed by a

- single gunshot to the head with a .22 caliber firearm. There was no expended shell casing found on scene. Numerous items were stolen from the residence including jewelry, an Apple watch, iPhone, and an iMac all-in-one desk top computer.
- 4. On January 13, 2019, Ms. Renken was found deceased in her aforementioned residence. The main gate to Ms. Renken's approximately 1.63 acre property was askew and a gate to a dog run on the back of the property was open. Ms. Renken was found on the master bedroom floor. Ms. Renken was shot four times. The investigation revealed that the perpetrator fired at least five shots inside the residence. A near completely intact expended .22 caliber round was found on the hallway floor, and a portion of an expended .22 caliber round was recovered from the door jamb of a closet/pantry near the kitchen and hallway area of the residence. The investigation suggests Ms. Renken was shot in the face with .22 caliber "snake shot" and was then shot three more times while attempting to retreat into her bedroom, or while in her bedroom, where she ultimately succumbed to the four gunshot wounds. No expended shell casings were found at the scene.
- 5. On January 16, 2019, Mr. and Mrs. David were found deceased in their aforementioned residence. Responding WCSO deputies discovered an open door leading into a mudroom in the rear of the residence. Upon entering the mudroom Deputies discovered Mrs. David. Deputies then found Mr. David in the master bedroom. Both victims had been shot in the head. Deputies further discovered that the David residence had been ransacked consistent with a

 burglary; drawers and cabinets were open and property was missing. Two empty gun cabinets were located. Deputies also discovered a live .22 caliber "snake shot" round, laying on the floor of the kitchen. No expended shell casings were found at the scene.

- 6. On January 13, 2018, DCSO Detectives applied for and received a search warrant seeking records and connection information associated to Ms. Koontz's stolen Apple Watch from the technology company Apple. DCSO Detectives received records and data from Apple pursuant to the search warrant issued on January 13, 2019. Upon a review of the records and data received from Apple, it was learned that Ms. Koontz's Apple Watch attempted to connect to Apple services using an Apple Account that did not belong to Ms. Koontz. DCSO Detectives were able to determine that the connections attempted by Ms. Koontz's Apple Watch using the Apple Account not belonging to her occurred after Ms. Koontz's murder. DCSO Detectives determined that the Apple Account used by Ms. Koontz's Apple Watch to connect to Apple services after her murder was an Apple Account that likely belonged to Sonia Guzman living in Carson City, Nevada.
- 7. While investigating Ms. Guzman's identity, law enforcement officers determined that Ms. Guzman had a son, identified as Wilber Ernesto Martinez Guzman (hereinafter referred to as "Martinez Guzman").

 His date of birth is believed to be February 2, 1999.
- 8. Detectives learned from the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles database that Ms. Guzman registered two vehicles to her name on January 8, 2019, using an address of 2890 Menlo Drive, Apartment

- 11, Carson City. Ms. Guzman registered a 2006 BMW 325i sedan bearing Nevada license plate 949ZHS and a 2011 Toyota Corolla sedan bearing Nevada license plate 024G54.
- 9. Through the course of the investigation into the events at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. David, detectives were informed about a former landscaper who was providing their landscape services. The landscaper was identified and interviewed in furtherance of this investigation. Through the course of the interview, detectives were informed that a person identified as "Ernesto" worked at Mr. and Mrs. David's residence from April 2018 through the end of July 2018. Detectives were informed that "Ernesto" had worked at the Davids' residence approximately ten (10) to fourteen (14) times during those months. "Ernesto" was confirmed to be Martinez Guzman via a photograph shown to the landscaper.
- 10. On January 18, 2019, the WCSO, the DCSO, the Carson City Sheriff's Office (CCSO), and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, initiated a surveillance and intelligence gathering operation related to Ms. Guzman and her son, Martinez Guzman. While surveilling the aforementioned Menlo Drive residence, Detectives witnessed a male subject, matching the description of Martinez Guzman, frequently coming and going. Martinez Guzman was driving to locations nearby, and returning home, repeatedly. Martinez Guzman was driving the 2006 BMW.
- 11. On January 19, 2019, detectives learned Martinez Guzman pawned a gold "Elks" ring in Carson City, Nevada, on January 17, 2018.

 Detectives have determined that the gold ring was stolen from the

scene of the Davids' murders on January 15-16, 2019. It was also learned that Martinez Guzman pawned 16 silver rings in Carson City, Nevada, on January 14, 2019. Detectives determined the 16 silver rings were stolen from the scene of Ms. Koontz's murder on January 9-10, 2019.

- 12. On January 19, 2019, at approximately 3:50 PM, Martinez Guzman was contacted by members of the CCSO and arrested for possession of stolen property and burglary in Carson City, Nevada, related to the above mentioned pawn transactions. When Mr. Martinez Guzman was taken into custody, he was driving the aforementioned 2006 BMW.
- 13. That same day, your affiant conducted an interview with Martinez Guzman at the CCSO. During the interview, Martinez Guzman confirmed that he lived at the aforementioned Menlo Drive address. He also confirmed that he was previously employed as a landscaper for the individual's company described above in paragraph 9.
- 14. Martinez Guzman admitted that he burglarized Mr. and Mrs.

 David's aforementioned property a "few weeks" before the murders of Ms. Koontz and Ms. Renken. Martinez Guzman indicated that he went to the Davids' residence in Reno a total of three (3) times, but burglarized out-buildings the first two (2) times. Martinez Guzman stated the first time he took only a "machine" which he described as "one of those small ones to cut a thing."
- 15. With respect to the second burglary, Martinez Guzman admitted to stealing fishing poles and a "revolver" that were located within a trailer. He described the gun to hold nine (9) bullets and had been located in a "case" in the trailer when he took it.

- 16. Martinez Guzman admitted that he used this stolen revolver from the Davids' trailer in the murders of both Ms. Koontz and Ms. Renken. He additionally admitted that he used this same revolver in the murders of the "elderly couple" from Reno identified as Mr. and Mrs. David.
- 17. As to the murder of Ms. Koontz, Martinez Guzman explained that he entered her residence through an open/unlocked back door. He explained that a woman came out and he shot her. Martinez Guzman went on to admit that he stole an Apple watch and a computer from this residence.
- 18. As to the murder of Ms. Renken, Martinez Guzman stated he entered through an open/unlocked back door. Martinez Guzman indicated that a woman woke up and came out. He admitted that he shot the victim "several times and then I ran." Martinez Guzman was adamant that he did not steal anything from this residence as he "got scared".
- 19. As to the murders of Mr. and Mrs. David on January 16, 2019, Martinez Guzman stated that, at approximately 0600 hours, he arrived at the Davids' residence. Martinez Guzman indicated that, while he was entering the residence, "The lady was coming out. I got scared and shot at her." Martinez Guzman went on to indicate that the male victim was sitting on the bed, getting dressed when Martinez Guzman shot him. From the Davids' residence, Martinez Guzman admitted that he stole guns and anything else he thought he "could use."

- 20. Your affiant asked about the location of the gun that was used in the commission of the four (4) homicides referenced above.

 Martinez Guzman stated that the gun was inside the BMW he was driving when arrested.
- 21. Martinez Guzman was asked about the location of the property taken from the residence of Mr. and Mrs. David. He indicated that he buried the stolen property near a "rifle range" in Carson City. Martinez Guzman provided a description of the location of the items.
- 22. Detectives completed a search of the area described by Martinez Guzman. They located a large hole dug in the ground. In the hole they found guns, ammunition, and gun cases belonging to the Davids wrapped in a large tarp.
- 23. Detectives sought and obtained a search warrant for the BMW referenced above. During the execution of the search warrant, detectives located a .22 caliber revolver, with a nine (9) shot cylinder.
- 24. Detectives sought and obtained a search warrant for the Defendant's home at 2890 Menlo Drive #11 in Carson City Nevada. During the execution of that warrant, detectives recovered several items stolen from the residences of Ms. Koontz and Mr. and Mrs. David.

For the properties of the pavider of the live .22 caliber "snake shot" round located in the Davids' aforementioned residence after their murders. DNA evidence was also obtained from the grip area of the .22 caliber revolver, with a nine (9) shot cylinder, recovered from the aforementioned BMW. A reference DNA sample was taken from Martinez Guzman after his arrest by the CCSO. The reference sample taken from Martinez Guzman was determined to be the same as the DNA profiles taken from the live .22 caliber "snake shot" round and the grip area of the .22 caliber revolver.

That based upon the foregoing information, your affiant has probable cause to believe that Wilber Ernesto Martinez Guzman has committed four (4) counts of Murder with the use of a Deadly Weapon, a violation of NRS 200.010, NRS 200.030, and NRS 193.165, felonies, one count of Burglary, a violation of NRS 205.060, a felony, and four (4) counts of Burglary involving a Firearm, a violation of NRS 205.060, felonies, which were committed on or about January 3, 2019, January 4, 2019, January 9-10, 2019, January 12-13, 2019, and January 15-16, 2019, in Washoe County, Nevada and Douglas County, Nevada.

Wherefore, your affiant requests that a Warrant of arrest issue for Wilber Ernesto Martinez Guzman.
