MATH AND ENGLISH PLACEMENT

Students are placed in math and English courses based on ACT (or SAT) subtest scores. The goal is to place students in courses that are both challenging and for which they are adequately prepared. The placement information below does not reflect dual credit, Post Secondary Education Option (PSEO), Advanced Placement (AP) or transfer credit. If you have these types of credits, be sure to have official scores and/or transcripts sent to the NDSU Admissions office. At this time, the scores below should be used to determine if further placement testing is needed.

Based on your math ACT sub-test score or your combined SAT math and reading score, you are eligible to enroll in **Math 98 (Intermediate Algebra)** per the North Dakota University System Policy 402.1.2. Students who are not transferring in college-level math credit should take the NDSU Math Placement Test at least 48 hours before their scheduled Orientation to determine eligibility for higher level placement.

Please review the <u>NDSU Math Placement Test Instructions</u> before taking the test. More details about math placement procedures at NDSU are on the <u>NDSU Math Placement Procedures page</u>.

Based on your math ACT sub-test score or your combined SAT math and reading score, you are eligible to register for **Math 98 (Intermediate Algebra)** per the North Dakota University System Policy 402.1.2. Students who are not transferring in college-level math credit should take the NDSU Math Placement Test. The NDSU Placement Test will become available to you and instructions for how to access the test will be sent to you within about a month of your orientation date. Based on your English ACT sub-test score or your SAT writing score, you are eligible to enroll in **ASC 87** (**College Writing Prep II**) (Offered collaboratively with North Dakota State College of Science on the North Dakota State University campus). Students who believe that their abilities are higher than the placement into ASC 87 can contact NDSU One Stop at 701-231-6200 for information about taking an English placement exam to challenge their initial placement.

Your system account allows you access to Campus Connection, the system students use to view and accept financial aid awards, register for classes, purchase parking permits, view account balances and much more. - <u>Electronic ID and password</u>. Select "Step 2" to activate your electronic ID. Your electronic ID allows you access to campus computer clusters and Blackboard to take the online Math Placement Test (if applicable). - Transcripts of any college course work completed since admission to NDSU (official transcripts must be sent directly from previous institution(s) to the Office of Admission, NDSU Dept. 5230, P.O. Box 6050, Fargo, ND 58108).
- Picture ID to obtain an NDSU ID Card. Student accounts will be charged \$20 for the ID card.

OTHER THINGS TO REMEMBER

- <u>Set up and check your NDSU email account</u>. Select "Step 3" to set up your NDSU email account. Email is an official form of communication from the university. Please check it regularly so you don't miss any important messages.
- ID card photo submission. Please submit your photo for your NDSU ID Card at least 24 hours prior to your Orientation arrival.
- Complete your Financial Aid Checklist, including entrance loan counseling (if applicable).
- <u>Submit your immunization records</u>. Students enrolled at NDSU must provide immunization documentation for measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) including two doses after one year of age and proof of immunity against meningococcal disease after age 16. Students who have lived or traveled outside the United States for 30 days or more are asked to contact Student Health Service (SHS) to ask if a tuberculosis screening is needed. Documentation must be submitted to SHS before the start of classes. For information about turning in your records, please visit the SHS website.
