**PALO ALTO MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHER, DAVID HOUSE, EXCULPATED BY
POLYGRAPH EXAM**

[BRYAN, TEXAS]— PALO ALTO MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHER, DAVID HOUSE, WHO WAS SUSPECTED OF COMMITTING INDECENCY WITH A CHILD HAS BEEN EXCULPATED BY A POLYGRAPH EXAMINATION.

SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE INVESTIGATION, HOUSE HAS COOPERATED WITH THE AUTHORITIES AND GAVE A VOLUNTARY STATEMENT TO K.I.S.D. INVESTIGATOR, RALPH DISHER. AFTER BEING CONFRONTED WITH THE FALSE ALLEGATION, HOUSE RETAINED BRYAN, TEXAS ATTORNEY, RICK DAVIS, TO ASSIST HIM IN HIS RESPONSE.

DAVID HOUSE HAS AN EXEMPLARY RECORD WITH THE KILLEEN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT WHERE HE HAS BEEN EMPLOYED FOR 14 YEARS. HE HAS TAUGHT ON THE PALO ALTO CAMPUS SINCE AUGUST 2015.

THE POLYGRAPH EXAMINATION WAS CONDUCTED BY MARIA HUBBARD, A POLYGRAPH EXAMINER LICENSED BY THE STATE OF TEXAS. A COPY OF THE EXAM WITH RESULTS IS ATTACHED.

IN ORDER TO PROVIDE ADDED ASSURANCE TO THE DISTRICT THAT THE ACCUSATIONS AGAINST HIM ARE FALSE, HOUSE HAS VOLUNTEERED TO SUBMIT TO A SECOND POLYGRAPH EXAMINATION CONDUCTED BY AN EXAMINER NAMED BY THE DISTRICT. HE HAS ALSO OFFERED TO SUBMIT TO A PSYCHO-SEXUAL EVALUATION TO PROVE THAT HE HAS NO SEXUAL ATTRACTION TO CHILDREN.

MR. HOUSE IS ALSO COOPERATING WITH POLICE DETECTIVES WHO HAVE A STATUTORY DUTY TO INVESTIGATE ANY ALLEGATIONS OF CHILD ABUSE.

HOUSE'S ATTORNEY, RICK DAVIS, SAID "WE THINK THAT THE TIMING OF THE FALSE ALLEGATIONS IS TELLING. THE ALLEGATION WAS MADE AT THE END OF THE FIRST NINE WEEK GRADING PERIOD AFTER MR. HOUSE HAD BEEN CONTACTING SOME STUDENTS' PARENTS ABOUT DEFICIENT PERFORMANCE AND UNSATISFACTORY CONDUCT IN THE CLASSROOM. MR. HOUSE IS A DEDICATED EDUCATOR WITH AN EXEMPLARY REPUTATION. HE LOVES TEACHING. WE HOPE THAT HE IS SOON PERMITTED TO GET BACK TO THE VOCATION THAT HE LOVES, TEACHING YOUNG PEOPLE."

Allegations

At Mr. Rick Davis' request and Mr. House's written consent, he was interviewed and administered a Polygraph Examination on October 24, 2017. The following will constitute a CONFIDENTIAL report of that Interview and Polygraph Examination.

PURPOSE OF EXAMINATION:

Mr. David House has been employed as a teacher at Palo Alto Middle School since August 2015. He has allegedly been accused of sexually touching a female student at this school by fondling her breasts on or about October 11, 2017. Mr. House reported he does not know why the alleged victim has made this allegation and denies engaging in sexual behavior of any kind with this minor or any other minor during his entire professional career as an educator. This Examiner discussed sexual terms with Mr. House: Sexual Parts (penis, testicles, vagina, buttocks and breasts); Sexual Gratification and Sexual Pleasure; Sexual Intercourse (vaginal, oral and anal); Physical Sexual Contact and Sexual Behavior (physical and non-physical). Mr. House verbalized his

understanding of these terms. At this time, he verbalized his desire to submit to polygraph testing to clear his name and reputation.

It should be noted, this polygraph examination was conducted without the aid of an official law enforcement report and relevant questions created for use during the In-Test Phase were constructed by case facts derived from Mr. House and his attorney, Mr. Rick Davis.

Pretest Interview

As required by the Texas Polygraph Examiners Act, Mr. House was informed of his rights:

1. Mr. House was informed that taking a polygraph in the State of Texas is strictly voluntary and can only be conducted if he is physically suitable for testing on this date.
2. Mr. House was informed that this Examiner may record both audibly and visually the entire polygraph examination process for quality control purposes.
3. Mr. House was informed that due to the nature of the present allegations, information concerning his sexual behavior would be obtained during the test interview and questions about his behavior would be asked on the polygraph examination(s).
4. Mr. House was informed his polygraph examination would be limited in scope to the specific information discussed during the pre-test interview.
5. Mr. House was informed information obtained during the polygraph examination process, including the results of his exam and all relevant documents, would be/could be disseminated to attorney, Mr. Rick Davis or his attorney's designee, as well as, the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulatory Services (for quality control purposes).
6. Mr. House was informed he would be given the results of his polygraph examination(s) prior to his departure from the polygraph examination testing location.
7. Mr. House signed a consent form on this date, agreeing to have a polygraph examination conducted as outlined by the stipulations recorded above.

Background and Present Status

Health

Mr. House informed this Examiner he was in relatively good health. He denied being under the influence of alcohol or any other mind-altering substances on the test date. He denied being excessively sleepy, reporting he had received approximately six to seven hours of sleep the evening before. Mr. House denied health issues with his lungs or any other mental health issues on the testing date.

Examination Phase

At the conclusion of the pre-examination interview Relevant, Irrelevant and Comparison questions to be asked on the polygraph examination were developed with Mr. House. The questions asked on the polygraph examination were formulated in the Air Force Modified General Question (MGQT) Format,

utilizing four relevant questions. The "MGQT" is a comparison question examination that has been validated and is standardized. Using a standardized methodology, the "MGQT" provides for a numerical evaluation of the physiological responses as recorded on the polygraph charts. The "MGQT" technique is widely accepted in the profession and is extensively used by numerous governmental investigative agencies to include the Department of Defense, Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Texas Department of Public Safety. All questions asked on the polygraph exams were reviewed on a word-for-word basis with Mr. House prior to the beginning of the In-test phase of his examination. Prior to the relevant charts being conducted, an acquaintance test was utilized to acquaint Mr. House with proper polygraph testing procedures.

The following Relevant questions were asked in the "MGQT" format. Those questions and Mr. House's responses were:

4R ON OR ABOUT OCTOBER 11TH, DID YOU TOUCH ANY FEMALE PALO ALTO STUDENTS' BREASTS?

ANSWER: NO

5R SINCE STARTING EMPLOYMENT AT PALO ALTO, DID YOU TOUCH ANY FEMALE STUDENTS' BREASTS FOR SEXUAL GRATIFICATION PURPOSES?

ANSWER: NO

7R SINCE BEGINNING YOUR EMPLOYMENT AT PALO ALTO, DID YOU ENGAGE IN ANY SEXUAL BEHAVIOR WITH ANY STUDENT?

ANSWER: NO

8R SINCE AUGUST 2015, DID YOU ENGAGE IN ANY PHYSICAL SEXUAL CONTACT WITH ANY STUDENT AT PALO ALTO MIDDLE SCHOOL?

ANSWER: NO

Prior to conducting Mr. House's chart phase of his polygraph examination, this Examiner explained to him in a brief synopsis, how the polygraph instrument operates. He was afforded an opportunity to acquaint himself with the polygraph instrument and its components.

Chart Evaluation and Analysis

At the conclusion of the third relevant chart, all three charts were carefully reviewed, evaluated and numerically scored using a standardized procedure. The resulting numerical score requires this Examiner to offer the opinion that Mr. House was **truthful** in his answers to the above relevant questions.

Post-Test Phase

Mr. House was informed of his **NO DECEPTION INDICATED** results on his polygraph examination prior to his departure from the Law Offices of Rick Davis and Associates polygraph testing site located in Bryan, Texas.
