"One-Stop Shop" Offering Relief and Recovery Resources Friday and Saturday

EAU CLAIRE, WI... (May 18, 2017) – The Red Cross is partnering with local organizations to open a "one-stop shop" for residents affected by Tuesday's tornado. On Friday, May 19th the Multi-Agency Relief Center (MARC) will be open from 1:00pm to 8:00pm and Saturday May 20th from 9am to 4pm at Mosaic Telecom, 401 South 1st Street in Cameron

Trained Red Cross caseworkers will help people create personal recovery plans, navigate paperwork, and locate assistance for their specific disaster-caused needs. Representatives from more than a dozen community partners will be in attendance including rent assistance, security deposits, furniture, household supplies, food, clothing and more.
