84. NARRATIVE OF THE FACTUAL BASIS FOR PROBABLE CASE: The undersigned certifies and swears that he/she has just and reasonable grounds to believe that the heretofore named defendant did commit the violations of law as stated above and the factual basis for this belief is as follows:

Narrative

On March 19, 2017, at approximately 8:52 p.m., the Panama City Beach Police Department responded to Rock'it Lanes parking lot in reference to a shooting. Officers arrived and found a man, Ples Robinson, lying on the ground. Robinson later died as a result of multiple gun shot wounds.

Through the course of the investigation Diontez Jerel Mccoy, the defendant, was developed as a suspect.

On March 20, 2017, Mccoy provided a statement in relation to the homicide. During a post Miranda interview, he stated the following; while in the parking lot of Rock'it Lanes, the victim approached Mccoy and the his co-defendant, Tyree Maddox. In response, Maddox pulled his firearm, a 9 mm handgun and fired at least one round that struck the victim. Robinson grabbed his abdomen and fell to the ground and everyone began to flee the scene, except Mccoy. Mccoy drew his firearm, a .380 Smith & Wesson bodyguard, and shot Robinson twice while he was defenseless and lying on the ground. He then fled the scene. Mccoy stated while running from the scene, he disposed of his gun by throwing it "in the bushes". Maddox and Mccoy were seen running from the scene and were detained by law enforcement. Mccoy provided his identification to the officer and was placed in the back seat of a patrol car. Mccoy stated while in the vehicle, he stuffed the contents of his pockets (cannabis and several live .380 rounds) into the back seat of the patrol car in an attempt to conceal them.

Mccoy's handgun was located and recovered from some bushes in the parking lot.

Other witnesses corroborated Mccoy's statement that Maddox shot Robinson first and then Mccoy shot Robinson two additional times.

It should be noted Mccoy was adjudicated guilty of a felony offense in a Bay County Court in 2013, case number 13000552CFMA.

Due to the aforementioned facts, your affiant has probable cause to believe the defendant did commit the offenses of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, tampering with evidence and second degree murder. He did so by unlawfully being in possession of a firearm after being convicted of a felony offense, attempting to dispose of a firearm and ammunition, which has been deemed evidence in a homicide investigation and by killing a human being (Ples Robinson), while perpetrating an act imminently dangerous to another and evincing a depraved mind regardless of human life, although without any premeditated design to effect the death of any particular individual, in violation of Florida Statute 782.04.

This offense did occur in the city of Panama City Beach, Bay County, Florida.
