Scott led the University of Nebraska Cornhusker football team to a National Championship in 1997. He was also a Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award finalist and became only the tenth player in college football history to both run and pass for 1,000 yards in a season; and

After graduating from the University of Nebraska, Scott was selected in the third round of the 1998 NFL Draft by the New York Jets. During his professional career he played for the Jets, Cleveland Browns, Green Bay Packers, and Tampa Bay Buccaneers; and

Scott began his coaching career in 2002 serving as a graduate assistant for Nebraska, and continued his coaching career at schools such as Kansas State, Northern Iowa, and Oregon before taking his first head coaching position in 2015 at the University of Central Florida; and

WHEREAS,

Through Scott's hard work, determination, and commitment to his players, he was able to turn the UCF football program around in just two years, leading them to an undefeated record in 2017; and

WHEREAS,

In December of 2017, Scott accepted the head football coach position at the University of Nebraska and moved back to his home state where he was welcomed by all Nebraska football fans; and

WHEREAS.

Growing up as a Nebraska kid, Scott knows the importance of Nebraska football to the state and because of his outgoing coaching style and how he pushes each player to be better, Scott will make Nebraska football great again; and

WHEREAS.

Nebraska football fans from all over the country want to welcome Scott home and wish him the best as he begins his new journey at his alma mater!
