I, as Sheriff of the Richmond County Sheriff's Office, do hereby very proudly issue this letter of appreciation to Investigator Cecil Ridley based on his professionalism while serving the citizens of our county.

Dated this day, the Thirteenth day of May, Two Thousand and Fourteen

While working a narcotics investigation on Hwy 56, Investigator Cecil Ridley took one case, and rolled that case into an even bigger case. Investigator Ridley made recorded phone calls and had a drug dealer, Tony Williams from Swainsboro, Georgia; agree to come to Augusta to deliver an amount of cocaine. Williams did deliver 330 grams of cocaine with a street value of \$33,000.00. Williams was arrested without incident. What makes this case special is that Williams was the target of a DEA/GBI investigation out of Savannah, Georgia. From interviews with Agents and subsequent interviews with informants, Williams was a source of supply for several large cocaine dealers in Augusta and was looking to purchase a house in the area so he could move to Augusta to broaden his drug dealing base. Also because of this arrest more arrest are expected of Augusta drug dealers who have been in business for years in Augusta

As a result of Investigator Ridley's actions, a large amount of drugs was prevented from getting to the streets and a drug dealer was shut down before setting up shop in the Augusta area and creating pain and suffering for the citizens of this county.

I, as Sheriff of the Richmond County Sheriff's Office, do hereby very proudly issue this letter & certificate of appreciation to Investigator Cecil Ridley for his participation in the below referenced case.

Dated this day, the Twenty Ninth day of October, Two Thousand and Thirteen.

On October 2, 2013 Investigators Matthew Perkins, Shedree Woods, Shannon Ryals and Cecil Ridley were working on complaints of drug activity, loitering and prostitution at Motel 6 at 201 Boy Scout Road. During the course of their surveillance, they observed a subject man handling a female at the back of a vehicle and loading sex paraphernalia into the trunk of the car. Investigators approached the subject who began pulling the female away from the vehicle to a room to avoid the investigators.

During the subsequent investigation, investigators learned that the subject was keeping two females in sexual servitude in two rooms of the motel against their will. He forced them into prostitution and kept control of money, food, clothing, and contact with the outside world. Recognizing the indicators of a predator, investigators furthered their investigation.

Utilizing sources from The Georgia Bureau of Investigation and Federal Bureau of Investigation, investigators freed the two females, one of which entered a protected witness status by the FBI and the other returned to her family. Agent Sara Thomas of the GBI identified this as a "Rock Solid" example of sex trafficking and highly praised Investigators Perkins, Woods, Ryals and Ridley. This is an example of police work that goes beyond the normal parameters of assigned duties and adhering to a principle of helping the community and enforcing the law.

I, as Sheriff of the Richmond County Sheriff's Office, do hereby very proudly issue this letter & certificate of appreciation to Investigator Cecil Ridley for his participation in the below referenced case.

Dated this day, the Twenty Eighth of May, Two Thousand and Thirteen.

Last month, Investigators Cecil Ridley and Shedree Woods interviewed a confidential and reliable informant in reference to a heroin dealer who was conducting business in the area of Wrightsboro Rd. Investigators Cecil Ridley and Shedree Woods along with Investigators Jason Kennedy, Matt Perkins, Julio Conception, Ty Hester, and Jose Ortiz set up surveillance and awaited the pre-arranged meeting of the confidential informant and the target. Once the meeting was engaged, officers moved in and recovered 7 grams of Heroin from the target. The target was taken into custody at which time an interview was conducted by Investigators Ridley and Woods. The target, now a cooperating source, turned over one of his supply sources who was hiding out in Columbia County due to Investigator Kennedy having outstanding Sale of Heroin warrants for his arrest. Sergeant Meagher contacted Sergeant Williams of the Columbia County Sheriff's Office and made arrangements for him and his deputies to meet with Investigators Ridley, Woods, and Kennedy. A plan was formulated to take Daggett into custody (keeping in mind RCSSO was working out of their jurisdiction), under the supervision of Sergeant Meagher. Daggett was detained and found in possession of an amount of heroin; a search warrant was applied for and received for Daggett's residence in Columbia County. During the search approximately six ounces of heroin and an unknown amount of currency were recovered. This is considered a large seizure of heroin, the largest in this area in approximately ten years.

These investigators went beyond their call of duty by taking the initial steps to go into another county and work a drug case which would not bring them any recognition other than the self-satisfaction of knowing that another major drug operator was off the street. These investigators are self-motivated and hard working. Thanks to the efforts of these individuals a large quantity of drugs are no longer available for the streets within our area and our community is better for it.

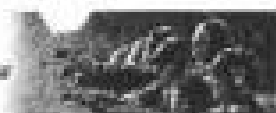

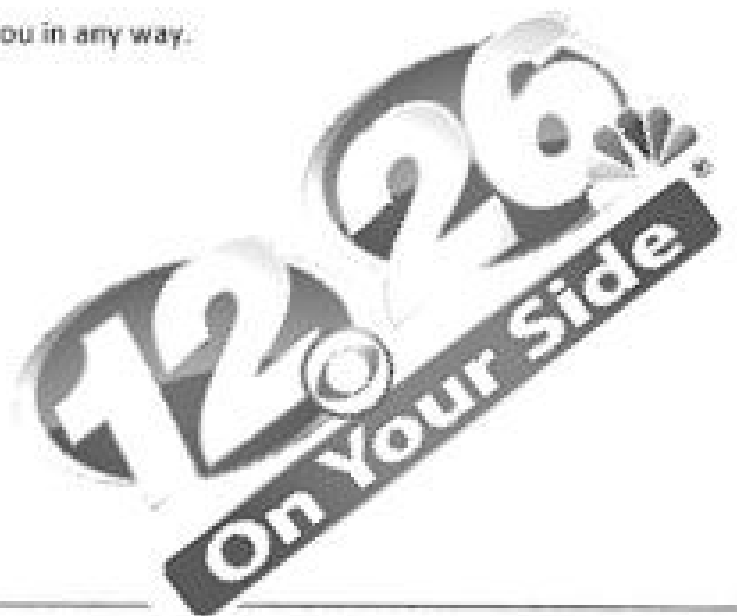

On Wednesday December 12, 2001, a resident of Richmond County, Brian Harrison was the victim of a Motor Vehicle Hijacking. Four suspects approached Harrison in the Food Lion parking lot at 3602 Windsor Spring Rd. and took Harrison's 1988 Buick Electra at gunpoint. On Thursday December 13, 2001, four suspects matching the same description robbed the Holiday Market 4127 Windsor Spring Rd. armed with three semi-automatic handguns. On Friday December 14, 2001 CST Sergeant Scott Gay advised his detail to aggressively patrol the area of Windsor Spring Rd. and Tobacco Rd. in an attempt to locate the suspects. At 2358 hours Deputy Larry Bracken and Deputy Brian Lovering observed four subjects matching the description walking on the 2500 block of Tobacco Rd. Upon seeing Deputies Bracken and Lovering, the four suspects fled on foot, at which time a foot pursuit ensued. Deputy Kevin Brown, Deputy Cecil Ridley, Deputy Danny Whitehead, Deputy Rachael Brooks and Sgt. Scott Gay immediately responded to the area, at which time three suspects were apprehended without incident. A broadcast was placed the fourth suspect, whom was subsequently located and arrested by Deputy Aaron Hannsz. During the course of the investigation, three of the four suspects admitted to both robberies and stated that they were on the way to commit another Motor Vehicle Hijacking when Deputies Bracken and Lovering observed them.

Because of the dedication to physical fitness and teamwork, Sgt. Scott Gay, Deputy Larry Bracken, Deputy Brian Lovering, Deputy Cecil Ridley, Deputy Danny Whitehead, Deputy Rachael Brooks, Deputy Kevin Brown, and Deputy Aaron Hannsz were not only able to apprehend four Robbery suspects, they prevented another resident of Richmond County from being the victim of a Violent Crime.

Sgt. Scott Gay, Deputy Larry Bracken, Deputy Brian Lovering, Deputy Cecil Ridley, Deputy Danny Whitehead, Deputy Rachael Brooks, Deputy Kevin Brown, and Deputy Aaron Hannsz exemplified outstanding work ethic and professionalism and should be commended for a job well done.

On November 13, 2001 at 1615 hours a resident of Richmond County, Cellus Smith was the victim of a home invasion. Carl Miller entered Smith's residence through the front door and took \$330 in cash and jewelry from Smith at gunpoint. Miller struck Smith on the head with the firearm and fled the scene on foot at which time the Richmond County Sheriff's Office was notified. A wanted poster was created and disseminated to the Road Patrol and the Crimes Suppression Team. On Friday November 16, 2001 CST Sergeant Scott Gay advised his detail to aggressively patrol the area of 12th St. in an attempt to locate Carl Miller. At 2214 hours Deputy Cecil Ridley observed a subject on the 1100 block of Maxwell Lane that matched the description of Carl Miller. Deputy Cecil Ridley attempted to speak with the subject, at which time a foot pursuit ensued. Deputy Larry Bracken, Deputy Kevin Brown and Sgt.
